4. California Children and Youth Behavioral Health Initiative (CYBHI):

Poole provided an update on the CYBHI grant. First 5 Shasta has received partial funding and completed a contract with SCOE and has a contract pending with Children's Legacy Center to provide training and implement and expand trauma-focused cognitive behavioral therapy (TFCBT), and some support groups for families.

5. Home Visiting Collaborative Update:

Poole provided an update on the Shasta HV Collaborative, which is part of a 22-county region working together to explore options and develop partnerships for home visiting in Shasta and other counties served Partnership Health Plan. We are focusing on strengthening our coordinated screening and referral through Help Me Grow to get families connected, to make it easier for providers to refer families to home visiting services and to eliminate confusion about eligibility and wait times by having one place where families can call in and find out what they're eligible for and

get connected to the home visiting service that is appropriate for their situation. We're also looking at supporting and training our home visiting staff and attracting more fathers into HV services.

6. Week of the Young Child, update: Jackie Scott, First 5 Shasta, Grants Coordinator

Scott provided an update/final review of Week of the Young Child (WOYC), activities which were held April 6 – 13, 2024. More than 2,000 children and families participated in the various WOYC events throughout the county.

7. PVCA Grant, update: Jackie Scott

Scott updated on the PVC Grant Cohort. The program has been a great success. Sixteen local ECE practitioners (grantees) have learned about advocacy, how the legislative process works, and how they can advocate and influence their legislators, how to talk to the people in charge, and how to know who the key stakeholders in Shasta County are.

8. Help Me Grow Update: Megan Johnson

Johnson stated that the SCOE staff working with HMG Shasta continues to provide developmental screenings (ASQ, ASQ-SE), referrals for service, and support services to families in Shasta County. We are still trying to reach families when their children are younger to conduct developmental screenings before age 1. The next Champions for Children is tentatively scheduled for September 7, 2024, at Turtle Bay Exploration Park.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:46 a.m. The next Evaluation Committee meeting is scheduled for 9:00 AM, Thursday July 18, 2024.
